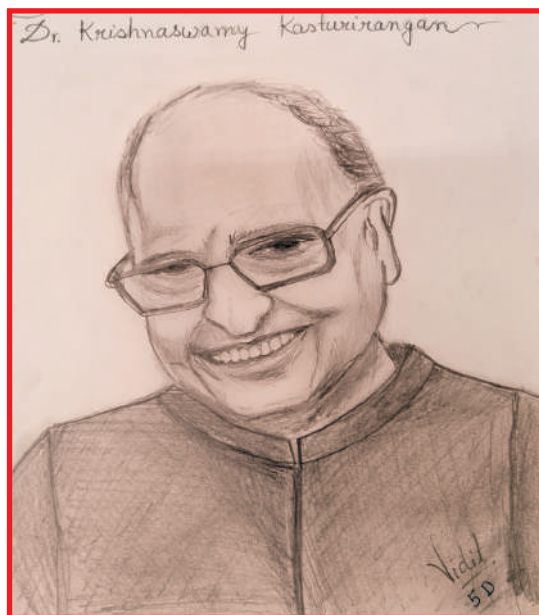
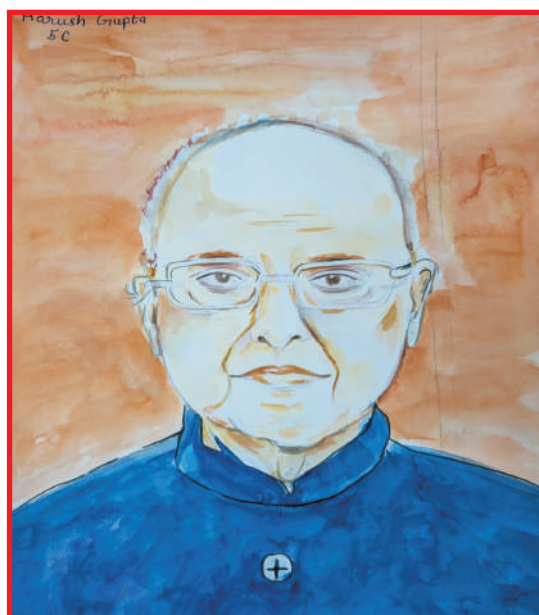
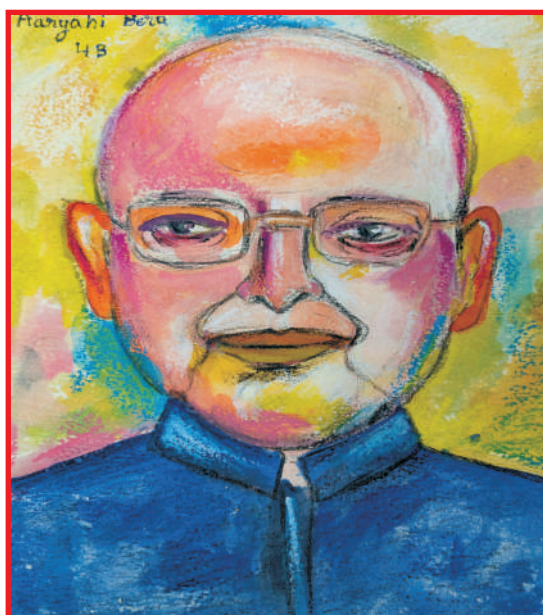
A Promising Start to the New Session- PTM

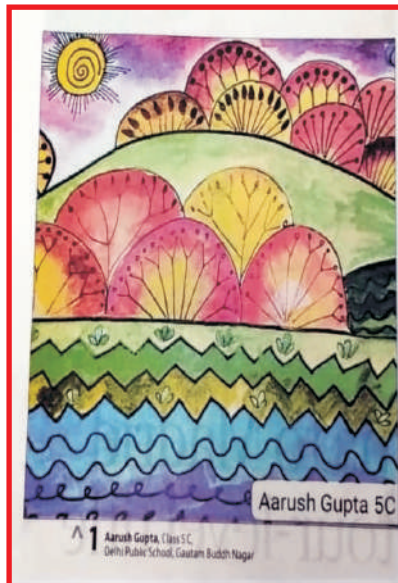
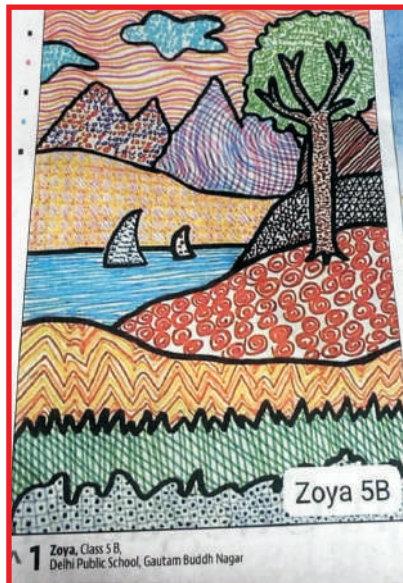
Readiness in Action- Mock Drill

Tech-Savvy Creators: Grades 3–5 Dive into Digital Discovery!

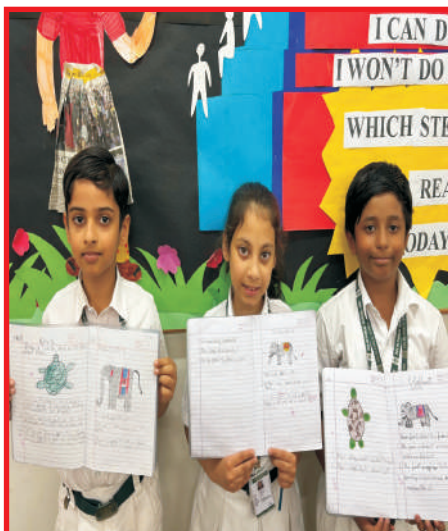

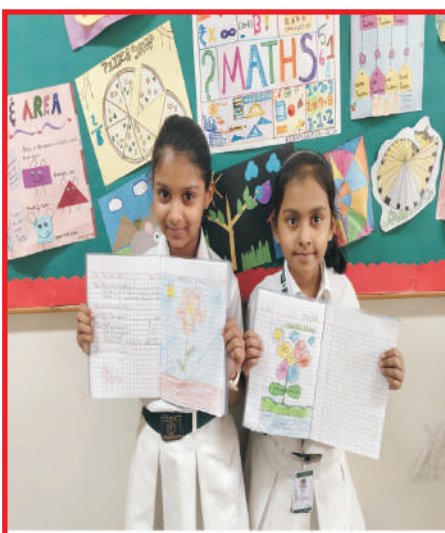
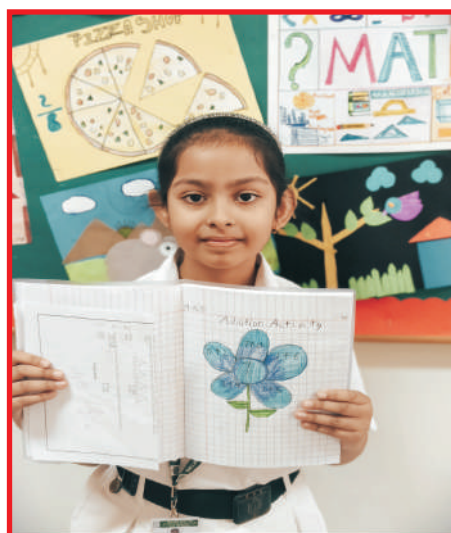


Mathematics
